TRENDnet's WiFi Everywhere™ Powerline 500 AV Access Point, model TPL-410AP, uses an electrical outlet to create or expand a wireless network. Two Powerline adapters are needed to start a network. Connect one adapter to a router and plug in the TPL-410AP on your electrical system to create or expand a wireless network.

WiFi Everywhere™ Powerline 500 Kit (TPL-410APK)

TRENDnet's WiFi Everywhere™ Powerline 500 Kit, model TPL-410APK, uses electrical outlets to create a hybrid Powerline-Wireless network. Easily install the included TRENDnet Powerline adapters (TPL-406E + TPL-410AP) to create a high-speed powerline network. Network the TPL-406E to a router and plug the TPL-410AP into an outlet on the electrical system to extend a high performance wireless network. Hardwire a smart TV, gaming console, or media player to the two Ethernet ports on the TPL-410AP.



- **Power Prong** Plugs into an available power outlet.
- **Diagnostic LEDs** Indicates the device status and connectivity.

Note: The following factors may affect the Powerline network's connection quality:

- Noise Generated by appliances which use your electrical system (e.g. Microwaves, ovens, blow dryer, iron, dishwasher, etc.). The quality of your household electrical wiring may also cause additional noise on your electrical system.
- **Distance** Long lengths of electrical wiring through your electrical system between connected Powerline adapters.

Power Saving: The device will automatically reduce power usage when the connected device via Ethernet is powered off, unplugged or inactive for more than 5 minutes. The device will return to active mode when the connected device via Ethernet is powered on and the link is active.

Note: This device offers EU compliant Standby mode functionality. To turn off the device, unplug it from the power outlet.

Expanding a Powerline Network

What is a network?

A network is a group of computers or devices that can communicate with each other. A home network of more than one computer or device also typically includes Internet access, which requires a router.

A typical home network may include multiple computers, a media player/server, a printer, a modem, and a router. A large home network may also have a switch, additional routers, access points, and many Internet-capable media devices such as TVs, game consoles, and Internet cameras.

- Modem Connects a computer or router to the Internet or ISP (Internet Service Provider).
- Router Connects multiple devices to the Internet.
- **Switch** –Connect several wired network devices to your home network. Your router has a built-in network switch (the LAN port 1-4). If you have more wired network devices than available Ethernet ports on your router, you will need an additional switch to add more wired connections.

How to expand a home network

Wireless Access Points add or extend wireless connectivity to an existing network. Integrated Powerline technology allows you to further extend your network using your existing electrical system in your home using multiple powerline adapters.


Basic Installation

Note: It is recommended to plug the adapters into nearby outlets before installing the devices to the desired locations.

Note: If you are connecting the adapters to a third party powerline device other than TRENDnet and encounter issues, please refer to the manufacturer's documentation for the appropriate sync button procedure.


Note: The sync button procedure steps below demonstrate using TRENDnet powerline model TPL-406E (included with the Powerline 500 Wireless Kit only) but the same procedure applies to TRENDnet powerline models TPL-407E/420E/421E.

Connecting the adapters using Powerline



- 5. Once you have successfully connected the powerline adapters through the electrical system, you can move the TPL-410AP to the desired location to create or extend wireless connectivity to your existing network.
- 6. For added security the TPL-410AP has been pre-configured with a unique wireless network name (SSID) and wireless key which can be found on the Preset Wireless Settings sticker or device label. Use these settings to connect your wireless laptops, mobile devices, and other wireless network devices to your network.




Note: Your access point management page default IP address http://www.ntp://newerline (when the computer is connected directly to TPL-410AP's LAN port) is accessed through the use of your Internet web browser (e.g. Internet Explorer®, Firefox®, Chrome™, Safari®, Opera™) and will be referenced frequently in this User's Guide.

If you have changed the default IP address, you will need to ensure that your computer is configured with IP address settings in the same subnet as the as the access point in order to access the access point management page. (Ex. Access Point IP address changed to 192.168.0.100 / 255.255.255.0, example computer address 192.168.0.25 / 255.255.255.0).

- 1. Plug the device into an available wall power outlet within reach of your computer's network cable.
- 2. Connect a network cable from your wireless access point network port into your computer's network port.



- 3. Assign a static IP address to your computer's network adapter in the subnet of 192.168.10.x (ex. 192.168.10.25) and a subnet mask of 255.255.255.0. (Please refer to the Appendix on page 55 on how to assign static IP address to your computer)
- 4. Open your web browser and go to IP address http://wlan.powerline (when the computer is connected directly to TPL-410AP's LAN port). Your access point will prompt you for a user name and password.




5. By default, the user name is *admin* and password is *admin*. You can also find the **Password** on a sticker on the side of the access point and on the label on the back of the access point. Enter your **Username** and **Password**, select your preferred language, then click **Login**.

Note: If you have changed the password already such as in the Setup Wizard, you will need to login using the new password.

4. TPL-410AP has pre-configured wireless settings, you can keep default settings or change it to your own settings, after that click **Next**.



Connect wireless devices to your powerline access point

A variety of wireless network devices can connect to your wireless network such as:

- Gaming Consoles
- Internet enabled TVs
- Network media players
- Smart Phones
- Wireless Laptop computers
- Wireless IP cameras

Each device may have its own software utility for searching and connecting to available wireless networks, therefore, you must refer to the User's Manual/Guide of your wireless client device to determine how to search and connect to this access point's wireless network.

Connect wireless devices using WPS

WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) is a feature that makes it easy to connect devices to your wireless network. If your wireless devices support WPS, you can use this feature to easily add wireless devices to your network.

Note: You will not be able to use WPS if you set the SSID Broadcast setting to Disabled or if you are using WEP or WPA security. Please note that WPS functionality will only be available when using WPA2 security.

There are two methods the WPS feature can easily connect your wireless devices to your network.

- Push Button Configuration (PBC) method
 - (RECOMMENDED) Hardware Push Button method—with an external button located physically on your access point and on your client device
- WPS Software/Virtual Push Button located in access point management page
- PIN (Personal Identification Number) Method located in access point management page

Note: Refer to your wireless device documentation for details on the operation of WPS.

Recommended Hardware Push Button (PBC) Method

 Note: It is recommended that a wireless key (passphrase or password) is created before connecting clients using the PBC method. By default your access point is preconfigured with a wireless encryption key. If no wireless key is defined when connecting via PBC, the access point will automatically create an encryption key that is 64 characters long. This 64 character key will then have to be used if one has to connect computers to the access point using the traditional connection method.

To add a wireless device to your network, simply push the WPS button on the wireless device you are connecting (consult client device User's Guide for length of time), then push and hold the WPS button located on your access point for 3 seconds and release it. The PWR LED will blink to indicate WPS has been activated on your access point.


For connecting additional WPS supported devices, repeat this process for each additional device.

PBC (Software/Virtual Push Button)

Setup > Wireless Setup > WPS

In addition to the hardware push button located physically on your access point, the access point management page also has push button which is a software or virtual push button you can click to activate WPS on your access point.

- 1. Log into your powerline access point management page.
- 2. Click on Wireless Setup, and click on WPS.
- 3. Select PBC under WPS mode, click on the PBC button on the right to start pairing.



4. Within 2 minutes, push the WPS button on the wireless device (consult wireless device's User's Guide for length of time) you are connecting. The wireless connection between the wireless client device and you r access point will automatically be established.

PIN (Personal Identification Number)

Setup > Wireless Setup > WPS

If your wireless device has WPS PIN (typically an 8-digit code printed on the wireless device product label or located in the wireless device wireless software utility), you can use this method.

- 1. Log into your access point management page.
- 2. Click on Wireless, and click on WPS.
- 3. Select **PIN** under WPS mode, type in the PIN you want to use then click **Apply**. **Note:** You may need to initiate the WPS PIN on your wireless device first when using this method. Refer to your wireless device documentation for details on the operation of WPS.



4. Within 2 minutes, initiate the WPS PIN method on the wireless device (consult wireless device's User's Guide for how to initiate the WPS method) you are connecting. The wireless connection between the wireless client device and you r access point will automatically be established.


<u>Setup</u>

Wireless Setup

Wireless Basic

This section outlines available management options under basic wireless sub tab.

- 1. Log into your powerline access point management page.
- 2. Click on Wireless Setup and click on Wireless Basic.
- 3. Review the basic wireless settings and click Apply when finished.



- Enable Wireless Interface Check the option to enable the wireless network/band or uncheck to disable. *Note: It is recommended to leave this setting checked.*
- Wireless Name (SSID): Enter the wireless name (SSID) for your wireless network. This acronym stands for Service Set Identifier and is the name of your wireless network. It differentiates your wireless network from others around you. By default, the access point's wireless name is unique to the device. If you choose to change the SSID, change it to a name that you can easily remember.
- Wireless Security Mode: Select the proper wireless encryption/key type for your wireless network.

How to choose the type of security for your wireless network

There are a few different wireless security types supported in wireless networking each having its own characteristics which may be more suitable for your wireless network taking into consideration compatibility, performance, as well as the security strength along with using older wireless networking hardware (also called legacy hardware). It is strongly recommended to enable wireless security to prevent unwanted users from accessing your network and network resources (personal documents, media, etc.). In general, it is recommended that you choose the security type with the highest strength and performance supported by the wireless computers and devices in your network. Please review the security types to determine which one you should use for your network.

Wireless Encryption Types

- WEP: Legacy encryption method supported by older 802.11b/g hardware. This is the
 oldest and least secure type of wireless encryption. It is generally not recommended
 to use this encryption standard, however if you have old 802.11 b or 802.11g wireless
 adapters or computers with old embedded wireless cards(wireless clients), you may
 have to set your access point to WEP to allow the old adapters to connect to the
 access point.
 - **Note:** This encryption standard will limit connection speeds to 54Mbps.
- WPA: This encryption is significantly more robust than the WEP technology. Much of the older 802.11g hardware was been upgraded (with firmware/driver upgrades) to support this encryption standard. Total wireless speeds under this encryption type however are limited to 54Mbps.
- WPA-Auto: This setting provides the access point with the ability to detect wireless devices using either WPA or WPA2 encryption. Your wireless network will automatically change the encryption setting based on the first wireless device connected. For example, if the first wireless client that connects to your wireless network uses WPA encryption your wireless network will use WPA encryption. Only when all wireless clients disconnect to the network and a wireless client with WPA2 encryption connects your wireless network will then change to WPA2 encryption. Note: WPA2 encryption supports 802.11n speeds and WPA encryption will limit your connection speeds to 54Mbps
- WPA2: This is the most secure wireless encryption available today, similar to WPA
 encryption but more robust. This encryption standard also supports the highest
 connection speeds. TRENDnet recommends setting your access point to this
 encryption standard. If you find that one of your wireless network devices does not
 support WPA2 encryption, then set your access point to either WPA or WPA-Auto
 encryption.

Note: Check the specifications of your wireless network adapters and wireless appliances to verify the highest level of encryption supported. Below is brief comparison chart of the wireless security types and the recommended configuration depending on which type you choose for your wireless network.

4. Click Apply when finish.

Steps to improve wireless connectivity

There are a number of factors that can impact the range of wireless devices. Follow these tips to help improve your wireless connectivity:

- 1. Keep the number of obstructions to a minimum. Each obstruction can reduce the range of a wireless device. Position the wireless devices in a manner that will minimize the amount of obstructions between them.
 - a. For the widest coverage area, install your access point near the center of your home, and near the ceiling, if possible.
 - Avoid placing the access point on or near metal objects (such as file cabinets and metal furniture), reflective surfaces (such as glass or mirrors), and masonry walls.
 - c. Any obstruction can weaken the wireless signal (even non-metallic objects), so the fewer obstructions between the access point and the wireless device, the better.
 - d. Place the access point in a location away from other electronics, motors, and fluorescent lighting.
 - Many environmental variables can affect the access point's performance, so if your wireless signal is weak, place the access point in several locations and test the signal strength to determine the ideal position.
- Building materials can have a large impact on your wireless signal. In an indoor environment, try to position the wireless devices so that the signal passes through less dense material such as dry wall. Dense materials like metal, solid wood, glass or even furniture may block or degrade the signal.
- 3. Antenna orientation can also have a large impact on your wireless signal. Use the wireless adapter's site survey tool to determine the best antenna orientation for your wireless devices.

4. Interference from devices that produce RF (radio frequency) noise can also impact your signal. Position your wireless devices away from anything that generates RF noise, such as microwaves, radios and baby monitors.

If possible, upgrade wireless network interfaces (such as wireless cards in computers) from older wireless standards to 802.11n or 802.11ac. If a wirelessly networked device uses an older standard, the performance of the entire wireless network may be slower. If you are still experiencing low or no signal consider repositioning the wireless devices, installing additional access points or wireless extenders.

PLC Settings

Setup > PLC Setting

These settings allow you to pair or not with other powerline devices in the same powerline network.



LAN Settings

Setup > LAN Setting

The device comes with default IP of 192.168.10.30. When connected to a network, the DHCP client mode will turn on.



Advanced Wireless

Advanced

These settings are advanced options that can be configured to change advanced wireless broadcast specifications. It is recommended that these settings remain set to their default values unless you are knowledgeable about the effects of changing these values. Changing these settings incorrectly can degrade performance.



Security

Setting up wireless security is very important. Leaving your wireless network open and unsecure could expose your entire network and personal files to outsiders. TRENDnet recommends reading through this entire section and setting up wireless security on your new powerline access point. Refer to wireless basic sections on how to pick the right security option for your network.



Access Control

This section allows you to allow or block certain wireless clients to connect to the wireless network.



Click **Enable Access Control** to turn on the feature, select White list or Black list then enter the MAC address then click on **Add**.

Note: If you white list the device, only the listed devices can access the powerline access point.

Maintenance

Device Management

In the **Old Password** field, enter the old password (by default, the password is admin) then enter the new password. Then enter the password again in the **Confirm Password** field to verify.




To save changes, click **Apply**.

Note: If you change the access point login password, you will need to access the access point management page using the User Name "admin" and the new password.

Reboot and Restore

You may want to restart or restore your powerline access point if you are encountering difficulties with your access point and have attempted all other troubleshooting.

Click on **Reboot** button will restart the device. Click **Restore** button will set the device back to factory default settings.



Firmware Update

TRENDnet may periodically release firmware upgrades that may add features or fix problems associated with your TRENDnet access point model and version. To check if there is a firmware upgrade available for your device, please check your TRENDnet model and version using the link. http://www.trendnet.com/downloads/

In addition, it is also important to verify if the latest firmware version is newer than the one your access point is currently running. To identify the firmware that is currently loaded on your access point, log in to the access point, click on the Administrator section and then on the Status. If there is a newer version available, also review the release notes to check if there were any new features you may want or if any problems were fixed that you may have been experiencing.




Please note the following:

- Do not interrupt the firmware upgrade process. Do not turn off the device or press the Reset button during the upgrade.
- If you are upgrade the firmware using a laptop computer, ensure that the laptop is connected to a power source or ensure that the battery is fully charged.
- Disable sleep mode on your computer as this may interrupt the firmware upgrade process.
- Do not upgrade the firmware using a wireless connection, only using a wired network connection.
- Any interruptions during the firmware upgrade process may permanently damage your access point.

Status

You may want to check the system information of your access point such as IP address settings, access point mode, wireless and wired network settings, access point wireless MAC addresses, and firmware version.



Installing your Powerline Adapters

Before you Install

- 1. Before you proceed with the installation, verify the following:
 - You already have a router already installed.
 - You already have Internet access through your existing network.
 - An Ethernet port (also called LAN port) is available on your router.
 - Verify that you have at least two Powerline adapters. You will need at least two Powerline adapters to create a Powerline network.

Note: The TPL-410AP package only includes a single Powerline adapter. The TPL-410APK package includes TPL-406E and TPL-410AP to create your Powerline network. Please ensure that your other Powerline adapter is HomePlug® AV or IEEE 1901 compliant (e.g. TRENDnet models TPL-406E, TPL-407E, TPL-420E, TPL-421E or another TPL-410AP.)


- 2. Plan the location of where you will install your Powerline adapters.
 - Avoid plugging the adapters into power strips, extension cords, or surge protectors as this may prevent the adapter from functioning correctly or degrade performance.
 - Avoid plugging the adapters into wall power outlets that are controlled by a light switch to prevent the Powerline adapter from being turned off accidentally.
 - Avoid plugging the adapters into wall power outlets that are located near appliances that consume a lot of power (e.g. refrigerators, washers, dryers) as this may degrade performance.
 - Make sure there is an available wall power outlet in the room where the router is installed and also near the router.
 - Make sure there is an available wall power outlet in the room where you want to extend network connectivity.

Connect a Powerline adapter to your router

1. Plug the Powerline adapter into an available wall power outlet near your router.

Note: This will allow devices connected to your Powerline network to access the Internet and other devices connected to your network.

- 2. Connect the included Ethernet cable (also called network cable) from the Ethernet port (also called network port) of your Powerline adapter to an available Ethernet port (also called LAN port) on your router.
- 3. Once the Powerline adapter is installed and connected to your router, verify that the **Power LED** is on or blinking and the **Ethernet LED** is on or blinking.



Add adapters to your network

Once you have installed and connected the first Powerline adapter to your router, you can easily extend your network to other rooms by adding additional Powerline adapters.

To extend your network using an additional Powerline adapter:

- 1. First, make sure the first Powerline adapter is installed and connected to your router. **Note:** This will allow devices connected to your Powerline network to access the Internet and other devices connected to your network.
- 2. Plug the additional Powerline adapter into an available wall power outlet in another room near a computer or network device (e.g. game consoles, network-enabled TVs, network attached storage, network media server/players, etc.) that you would like to connect to your network.
- 3. Connect the included Ethernet cable from the Ethernet port on your Powerline adapter to the to the Ethernet port of your computers or network devices.
- 4. After the additional Powerline adapter is connected and installed to your computer or network device, wait for the **DATA LED** to turn on. After the **DATA LED** turns on, verify that the **Power LED** is on, the **DATA LED** is on or blinking, and the **Ethernet LED** is on or blinking.

Note: To verify that your Powerline adapters are connected successfully to your network, you can check if the computer(s) or network device(s) can access the Internet through your Powerline network.

To install additional Powerline adapters in other rooms, repeat the steps above for each adapter.

Securing your Powerline Network

Powerline networks consist of two or more Powerline devices connected together using the same encryption key. TRENDnet Powerline adapters automatically connect to each other over a secure encrypted signal and share the same encryption key (Default encryption key: HomePlugAV).

In order for your Powerline devices to connect to the same Powerline network, the same encryption key must be assigned to all Powerline devices in that network. Powerline devices that are not assigned the same encryption key will not be able to connect to the Powerline network.

For additional security, TRENDnet recommends changing adapter default encryption key to prevent a neighbor with a Powerline adapter and the same default encryption key from gaining access to your network.

Note: After the default encryption key has been changed and the Powerline adapters have been connected using a new encryption key, the Powerline adapters will retain their security settings when they are unplugged and moved to a new location. No additional reconfiguration of the Powerline adapters is needed after the default encryption has been changed.

There are two methods to change the default encryption key:

- Use the physical Sync/Link button on your Powerline adapter to generate a random encryption key.
 - ****Recommended method****

OR

 Create a customized encryption key for your Powerline network using the Powerline Utility. (download from TRENDnet's website)

Troubleshooting

Q: I typed http://TPL-410AP in my Internet Browser Address Bar, but an error message says "The page cannot be displayed." How can I access the access point management page?

Answer:

Assign your computer a static IP address in the subnet of 192.168.10.x (ex. 192.168.10.25) and access the access point using the default IP address 192.168.10.100. http://192.168.10.100

Q: I typed http://192.168.10.100 in my Internet Browser Address Bar, but an error message says "The page cannot be displayed." How can I access the access point management page?

Answer:

- 1. Check your hardware settings again.
- 2. Make sure the LAN port you are connected to is on.
- 3. Make sure your network adapter TCP/IP settings are set to <u>Obtain an IP address</u> <u>automatically</u> or <u>DHCP</u> (see the steps below).
- 4. Make sure your computer is connected to one of the access point's LAN ports
- 5. Press on the factory reset button for 15 seconds, the release.

Windows 7

- a. Go into the **Control Panel**, click **Network and Sharing Center**.
- b. Click Change Adapter Settings, right-click the Local Area Connection icon.
- c. Then click **Properties** and click **Internet Protocol Version 4 (TCP/IPv4)**.
- d. Then click **Obtain an IP address automatically** and click **OK**.

Windows Vista

- a. Go into the **Control Panel**, click **Network and Internet**.
- b. Click **Manage Network Connections**, right-click the **Local Area Connection** icon and click **Properties**.

Q: The Wizard does not appear when I access the access point. What should I do? Answer:


- 1. Click on Main and Wizard on the left hand side.
- 2. Near the top of the browser, "Pop-up blocked" message may appear. Right click on the message and select Always Allow Pop-ups from This Site.
- 3. Disable your browser's pop up blocker.

Q: I cannot connect wirelessly to the access point. What should I do? Answer:

- 1. Double check that the Wireless LED on the access point is on.
- 2. Power cycle the router. Unplug the power to the access point. Wait 15 seconds, then plug the power back in to the access point.
- 3. Contact the manufacturer of your wireless network adapter and make sure the wireless network adapter is configured with the proper SSID. The default predefined SSID is printed on the device label on the bottom or on the sticker on the side of the unit.
- 4. To verify whether or not wireless is enabled, login to the access point management page, click on *Basic and Wireless*.

Please reference the items below if you continue to experience difficulty with installing and using your Powerline adapters.

Do not plug the Powerline adapters into a power strip. Make sure to plug the adapters directly into a power outlet and not through power strip. Using adapters through a power strip may negatively affect Powerline connectivity and performance.



- Do not use the Sync button for more than 2 Powerline adapters to connect simultaneously. Wait for each Powerline adapter to connect to your Powerline network one at a time before connecting the next adapter. Using more than one adapter to Sync simultaneously may cause some of your adapters not to Sync and establish connection to your Powerline network.
- Power-cycle the Powerline adapters by disconnecting them from their power outlets for 15 seconds and then reconnect them.
- If the Powerline (PL) LED is red, try plugging the Powerline adapter into another available power outlet. The quality of the connection may be better in a different power outlet.
- If you are having issues connecting the Powerline adapters after changing the
 encryption key using the Sync button or Powerline utility, reset the Powerline
 adapters to defaults using the physical Reset button.
- Using a pin or paperclip; press and hold the Reset button for 1 second on each Powerline adapter. All LEDs will turn off then turn back on. This will reset the Powerline adapters to their default settings. The default encryption key is HomePlugAV.
- The Powerline adapters can provide better connectivity and performance when plugged directly into a power outlet. Connecting the Powerline adapters to a power strip or surge protector may degrade or block Powerline signals.

- Avoid using the Powerline adapters on GFI protected outlets and electrical systems with AFCI circuit breakers. They may degrade or block Powerline signals.
- The Powerline adapters should not be used in areas with excessive heat.
- Florescent and incandescent lighting can generate significant Powerline interference.
- If your building has more than one circuit breaker box, the Powerline adapter
 may not be able to establish connectivity between them. In this case, connect a
 Powerline adapter into a power outlet located on each of the circuit breaker
 boxes. Then connect an Ethernet cable between the Powerline adapters to
 bridge the two circuits together.



Overlapping Powerline networks

It is possible to create multiple Powerline networks on the same electrical system separated and grouped by different network encryption keys. The Powerline networks will work and communicate independently of each other which can provide security between different groups of Powerline adapters. For example, if you have five powerline adapters (Adapter A, Adapter B, Adapter C, Adapter D, Adapter E), you can group Adapters A,B, and C together on one powerline network and group Adapters D and E on a different Powerline network. Each group will use a different encryption key.

Note: It is recommended that only a maximum of up to 4 Powerline networks can be created per electrical system. Any additional Powerline networks above the recommended may result in significant degradation in Powerline performance.
