#### Q: How can I configure my TV-IP400 (w) through the web-based configuration?

A: Open your web browser and type the IP address of the TV-IP400 (w) in the address bar. The default IP address is 192.168.0.20.

#### Q: What is the default IP address of my TV-IP400 (w)?


A: The default IP address is 192.168.0.20

#### Q: How can I view the TV-IP400 (w) remotely if it's behind a router or firewall?

A: Each camera behind a firewall or router will need to forward the port that the camera is using. The default port is 80.

If you are installing multiple cameras you must change the port on the additional cameras.

- **Step 1.** Open your web browser and type the IP address of the TV-IP400 (w) in the address bar. The default IP address is 192.168.0.20.
- Step 2. Click Configuration at the top of the page then click Network on the left hand side.



Step 3. Enable the Second HTTP Port and enter in the desired port for the camera in the Port Number field.

Note: If you are still unable to access the camera remotely please check the following.

- a) Please make sure the proper gateway address is entered. This will be your router's LAN IP Address.
- b) Please make sure the proper DNS servers are entered. You can find this information on your router's status page. If that information is not available on your router's status page please contact your ISP for your DNS server addresses and enter them.

#### A: Motion Configuration-1

- Step 1. Start the IPView Pro Program by going to Start>Programs>IPView Pro>IPView Pro.
- Step 2. Click on "System Configuration".

**Step 3.** Motion Configuration-1

This setting provides the commands for motion detection control. Before configuring, you should select one camera from the pull-down menu.


Step 4. Detect Region field:

Full picture – When you select this option, the camera will monitor the whole area.
Custom region – Click Add Region and then use your mouse to draw an area in the view screen. When motion is detected within the area, the camera starts recording automatically. You can set multiple areas in the view screen. Click Delete Region to r remove the area selected. Click Clear All Regions to remove all areas in the view screen.

**Step 5.** Sensitivity Level: Move the slide bar to adjust the sensitivity level for detecting motion to record video.

Note: The Sensitivity rating determines the amount of motion in the created window(s) to activate motion. Setting it too high or too low may produce unexpected results.

#### Step 5. Click "Save".



#### **Motion Configuration-2**

The Motion Configuration-2 setting allows you to configure the alarm and e-mail settings. - Invoke Alarm: Select this option to enable an alarm when motion is detected by the system. Note: Invoke Alarm requires that you have a trigger installed on the camera.

#### Q: How do I upgrade the firmware of my camera?

- A: Step 1. Open your web browser and type the IP address of the TV-IP400 (w) in the address bar. The default IP address is 192.168.0.20.
  - **Step 2.** Click on **"Configuration"** on the top bar, then click the **Firmware Upgrade** on the left hand side of the screen.
  - **Step 3.** Click **Browse** and locate the firmware file then click **Upgrade**.

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#### Q: Can my TV-IP400 (w) series camera use Power over Ethernet?

A: No. However, with the use of a TRENDnet TPE-102S you could power the unit via PoE.

Note: You must have a PoE injector for the TPE-102S. You could use either an existing PoE switch or a TPE-101I.

#### Q: How can I email snapshots based on motion from my camera?

- A: Step 1. Start the IPView Pro Program by going to Start>Programs>IPView Pro>IPView Pro.
  - Step 2. Click on the "System Configuration" button.
  - Step 3. Click on "Mailing Configuration" and input your mail settings.



Step 4. Enter your mail settings and click "Save".

Mail Server: Mail Server IP or Name.

Mail From: E-Mail Address of sender.

Mail To: E-Mail Address of receiver.

**Subject:** Can be any information to high light the message.

**User Name:** Enter the user name in this field.

**Password:** Enter the user password in this field to login receiver's mail server.

Interval Time: The time interval to send the next E-Mail.

## **Q**: How do I configure my TV-IP400 (w) series cameras to upload snapshots to an FTP server?

- A: Step 1. Open your web browser and type the IP address of the TV-IP400 (w) in the address bar. The default IP address is 192.168.0.20.
  - **Step 2.** Click on **Configuration** at the top of the page then click on **Upload** on the left hand side. Enter your FTP server information and click **"Save"**.

#### Q: Which web browsers will allow me to view the video from a TV-IP400 (w)?

A: Internet Explorer (5.0 or above) or Netscape Navigator (6.0 or above)

#### Q: How do I add user accounts to my TV-IP400 (w)?

- A: Step 1. Open your web browser and type the IP address of the TV-IP400 (w) in the address bar. The default IP address is 192.168.0.20.
  - Step 2. Click on Configuration at the top of the page then click on User on the left hand side. Enable the Access Control and enter in the desired usernames and passwords. Click Add to add the user.

Note: You can enable pan and tilt controls as well for individual users.



#### Q: How do I reset my TV-IP400 (w) back to factory defaults?

A: **Step 1.** Locate the reset button on the back of the unit.



- **Step 2.** Disconnect the power supply.
- **Step 3.** Press and hold in the reset button.
- Step 4. While holding in the reset button; reconnect the power supply.
- **Step 5.** Continue to hold in the reset button for approximately 10 seconds to restore the default settings.

#### Q: What do the LED's on the front of the camera mean?

#### A: LED 1 Power LED

The Power LED is positioned on the right side of the Internet Camera's lens while facing the Internet Camera. A steady BLUE light confirms that the Internet Camera is powered on.

#### LED 2 Link LED

The Link LED is positioned on the right side of the Internet Camera's lens while facing the Internet Camera. It is located right of the Power LED. A steady ORANGE light confirms that the camera has good connection to LAN connectivity. Depending on the data traffic the Link LED will begin to flash to indicate that the Internet Camera is receiving/sending data from/to the network.



#### Q: How do I set a password on my TV-IP400 (w)?

- A: Step 1. Open your web browser and type the IP address of the TV-IP400 (w) in the address bar. The default IP address is 192.168.0.20.
  - Step 2. Click on "System Administration".



**Step 3.** Click **Configuration** at the top of the page then click **System** on the left hand side. Enter in the desired username and password in the **Admin ID** and **Admin Password** fields. Click **Save**.

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#### Q: How do I connect my TV-IP400 (w) to my wireless network?

- A: Step 1. Open your web browser and type the IP address of the TV-IP400 (w) in the address bar. The default IP address is 192.168.0.20.
  - Step 2. Click on "System Administration".


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**Step 3.** Click **Configuration** at the top of the page then click **Wireless** on the left hand side. Enter in your wireless settings to match your existing wireless access point then click **Save**.

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#### Q: How do I control the pan and tilt of the TV-IP400 (w)?

A: From the web-based interface when viewing the image through Java or Active X, the controls are on the left hand side.



You can also control the pan and tilt through the IP View Pro application.



# Q: I have setup 5 preset positions, when I click on "swing", it just swings from position 1 to position 5 and then stops. Isn't the TV-IP400 (W) supposed to continue to swing?

A: No. The Camera only swings through the positions once and then stops at the position where you click on the "swing" button. For example, if the camera is at Preset Position 3 when you click on the "swing" button, the camera will swing through all the preset positions starting from Position 1. After the camera went through all the preset positions, it will return back to Position 3, where the camera started the "swing" action.

# Q: I have setup two user accounts and enabled "Access Control" in TV-IP400 (W), but in the TV-IP400 (W)'s configuration page, when I click on "Management" and then click on "User" to view the "Active Users", why is that there is nothing listed? 3-24-2006

A: The "Active Users" list shows only the users who are "active", with their web browser open and logged into the camera, viewing the camera's images. The "Active Users" list does not keep the Users' history, so if the user closes the web browser, the name will disappear from the list (you will need to click on "Refresh" to see the most current "Active Users").

## Q: I have Internet Explorer 6.0, I can access TV-IP400 (W)'s configuration page using its IP address, but when I click on "View Video-Java Mode", there is no image from the Camera. What could be wrong?

A: Your Internet Explorer's "Java Runtime" is probably outdated. Please open the browser, go to www.sun.com, and look for "Java Runtime". Download and install the latest version.
